AXA have advised **Unite** that it was important that this urgent work was undertaken forthwith and that it displays the company's commitment to equality as a preferred employer.

today, the company hopes that staff will appreciate the need to take this swift action.

Unite is pleased to see **AXA** replacing gender specific signage in the workplace and believes it will help break the glass ceiling and discrimination at work.

AXA's decision to recycle replaced signs from English offices by using them in Scotland has been criticsed by Unite as reinforcing nationalistic stereotypes. Whilst AXA claim that it is sensible to use these signs in a cost cutting environment, Unite is opposed to this and will be holding members meetings today with a view to taking industrial action.
